Prayer is not just about talking to God nor is it an obligation.

Prayer is first and foremost a <u>great privilege</u> given to all believers because of what Jesus had done on the Cross.

What is prayer?

Hebrews 10: 19-22 (ESV) "Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰ by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, ²¹ and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²² let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water." God wants us to pray. As much as it is privilege, it is also a priority.

Prayer should always be aligned with the character and word of God.

1 John 5:14-15 "Now this is the confidence that we have in Him, that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us, whatever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we have asked of Him."

What is prayer?

Prayer is much more than just requesting for God to do something.

Prayer can also be our:

Adoration to God for who He is
 Lament to God for what had happened
 Expression of joy and thanksgiving
 Confession of sin
 Silence in awe of the greatness and mystery of God

What is prayer?

How to pray?

- 1. Start from the home.
- 2. Find a quiet spot where you can always go to for personal time of prayer.
- 3. Remember, you don't have to use sophisticated words, but be conversational, and express simply as who you are to God.

How to pray?

- 3. Calm your heart and be silent for 2 minutes.
- 4. Thank the Lord for who He is.
- 5. Confess our sins committed for the day, if we know of any and ask God for forgiveness.
- 3. Bring your requests to God (World, Church, Family, Personal)
- 4. Close with the Lord's prayer or just say "In Jesus' Name. Amen"

Other ways to pray:

- Praying through the Scriptures
- Praying through the day

As you get more familiar with personal prayers, you can try praying through the Scriptures.

You can also try praying through the day for others who might ask you to pray for them or according to what you observed.

Praying through the Scriptures

The Psalms are a wonderful resources to pray. You can also use the Lord's prayer.

- 1. Pick a Psalm e.g. Psalm 1
- 2. Read the Psalm verse by verse
- 3. As you read each or a couple of verses, you can pause to pray according to what the verses are saying.

4. Using Psalm 1 as an example, as we read verses 1 and 2, we pray: "Lord, give me grace to not to be involved in the wicked schemes and even gossips of others. Help me be focused on your word instead!"

Praying through the Day

1. You might receive prayer requests through the day. You don't have to wait until a dedicated prayer time to pray. You can take some minutes to pray immediately on the request.

Or you might want to cultivate a good habit of praying as you observe or hear. For example, you observe that your colleague is troubled but not wanting to say.
You can pray for him or her in secret.

Praying in smaller groups

- 1. Keep prayers simple and to the point.
- 2. Don't have to use big words to impress but that which can be easily understood.
- 3. Keep prayers short so that others can have an opportunity to pray.
- 4. Be sensitive to the needs and also background of others, even as we pray.

Praying with the family

- 1. A praying church is one that starts with the family. A praying church is one where families within the church are praying consistently.
- 2. Take the lead (especially if you are the spiritual leader of the family) to set a consistent time to pray together as a family.
- With younger children, it will be great if parents can dedicate a time of devotion every evening. This will be the seed upon which your child / children grows to be a true disciple of Jesus Christ.

Praying with the congregation

1. It is a privilege to be called to lead in prayer during corporate worship.

2. Be clear and concise so that the congregation can hear you well.

3. Outline the prayer, if you are able, according to: World, Singapore, Church, Family and Personal.

4. Prayer to include current issues.
